

## HEYTHROP COLLEGE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Heythrop College recognizes that a concern for the environment is part of that concern for the common good which might be expected to characterise the activities of an institution dedicated to the teaching of philosophy and theology and which retains a modern Catholic ethos while offering an educational experience that respects all faiths and perspectives. It also recognises that this is a concern shared with the rest of the UK Higher Education sector.

The College aims:-

- To comply with all environmental legislation and codes of practice.
- To reduce the College's carbon emissions in line with government targets.
- To reduce the level of waste produced on the site and to increase the proportion of waste which is recycled.
- To take account of the environmental impact when procuring goods and services.
- To make efficient use of energy and water.
- To work with students, staff and other site users to promote an awareness of the environmental impact of activities on the site and the involvement of all in mitigating that impact.

The Estates Sub-Committee of the Finance and General Purposes Committee is responsible for ensuring compliance with this policy which will be reviewed annually.
